To Whom It May Concern

St Stithians College has as part of their strategic objective to be as carbon neutral as possible by 2015, taken all aspects of “greening” our campus into account. One of these has been to install the Lilydome units into our existing standalone urinals in an effort to save potable water.

We are a school of over 2,500 students and 350 staff, of which more than half are male – if each had to flush a urinal once a day, at approximately 4 litres of potable water per flush, that would equate to around 5,700 litres saving of potable water a day and around 1,065,900 litre per annum and this is being conservative.

The savings are not necessarily financial, but rather in conserving one of our most precious resources – WATER. Going forward with new buildings, we will most certainly be looking at installing waterless urinals. The savings on the water, time for cleaning, cleaning consumables, etc. makes it all worthwhile.

We have been using the Lilydomes at the College now for around 1 year, and have had some very positive feedback from the males that use the urinals with the Lilydomes installed – most being the reduction in odours.
